


National Respiratory Audit Programme (NRAP)



What is the asthma audit?

Some people with asthma have asthma attacks.

You have been given this leaflet so that we can tell you about an audit taking place in your hospital. An audit collects information that helps to show how doctors and nurses look after you in hospital when you've had an asthma attack. The audit started in June 2019 and will last until at least May 2028.



Your doctors and nurses will tell us about how they look after you when you have an asthma attack.

This will help us to see if they need to change anything to look after children like you better in hospital.

The audit will find out things like:

- > how old you are
- how the doctors and nurses looked after you in the hospital
- > what medicine you were given.



What happens next?

- 1. Our team will write a report about what we have found out.
- 2. We won't use your name, birthday or where you live when we write the report.
- 3. Doctors and nurses will find out from the report how well they look after children who have asthma attacks.





Your parent or carer can tell the doctors (or us) if they don't want your information added to audits like this. This won't change how you are looked after.



You are helping doctors and nurses look after children with asthma by being a part of this audit – thank you for joining in.
